Answer:

Increase proportion of investment in Active Travel to highest levels seen elsewhere in Europe per person per year.
Re-open disused rail lines and freeze new rail line creation.
Strongly advocate for public ownership of rail with reduction in rail fares by half.
Strongly advocate for public ownership of buses with free fares for all.
Prevent new trunk road building in all locations, diverting funds to active travel, road and pavement repair.
Encourage early adoption of a pavement parking ban in England.
Encourage Electronic Road Pricing to substitute for fuel duties.
Support scrappage schemes for the most polluting road vehicles all types, with credits for EV purchase OR cash for other uses.
